Territorial Perspective of Food Security Policies and Strategies

Objective

Improvement of the effectiveness of FAO policy assistance to member countries, through the development of a methodology to mainstream the Territorial Dimension in national Policies and Strategies for Food Security.

Methodology

Provide quantitative and qualitative tools for the analysis and integration of the Territorial Dimension in Food Security and Nutrition Policies, by combining georeferenced SAM (Social Accounting Matrices), Competitiveness Index and Livelihood Assessment tools to map and identify local opportunities and constraints to Food Security.

Outputs

- i) report on the theoretical underpinning of Territorial development and Food Security;
- ii) conceptual framework of the Territorial approach to mainstream the Territorial dimension in Food Security Policies and Strategies;
- iii) guidelines on how to mainstream the Territorial dimension in Food Security Policies and Strategies;
- iv) tools for analyzing Territorial policies for Food Security by integrating Territorial competitiveness indexes and the SAM approach;
- v) application to a country.
